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## **ABSTRACT**:

This abstract presents essential insights into culturally sensitive sexual health education within the Christian community, drawing on over a decade of experience as a Sexual and Reproductive Health Advocate and Projects Coordinator with the Cameroon Baptist Convention Health Services (CBCHS). The aim is to navigate the complexities of a diverse and faith-driven landscape.

Cameroon, with its religious diversity and a significant Christian population (69.2%), highlights the need for tailored sexual health education. The CBCHS operates across 41 healthcare facilities in the country, serving various Christian denominations.
